That conversation in 2015 led to establishment of a task force that ultimately grew to be the Grand Junction Regional Air Service

Collaboration Results in Big Win!

How often have we heard the phase “It takes a village...”? Obviously, the term has been way overused way too often but as I look at the recent economic development efforts in the community, I am reminded that it truly does take a village...a village of aligned individuals and organizations.



The recent announcement of the relocation of the Bureau of Land Management Headquarters to Grand Junction is a case in point. It was the efforts of elected officials such as Senator Cory Gardner and Congressman Scott Tipton who introduced legislation that elevated the conversation in Washington, D.C. Senator Michael Bennet offered support for the notion. Locally our City Council and County Commissioners led conversations and brought economic developers to the table such as Robin Brown with GJEP and Diane Schwenke with the Chamber. There were letters written, websites developed, economic data presented and strategy sessions conducted with local congressional representatives and ED Partners such as Derek Wagner, CMU, Greg Caton, City of Grand Junction, Rose Pugliese, Mesa County Commissioner and Bonnie Petersen, AGNC. It literally took a village of proponents to make our case for the location of this important federal agency headquarters in our community. **And it WORKED!**

While some may look at it simply in terms of new jobs to the community here at the Chamber, we are excited about the potential for additional economic activity that the project will generate. Business travel to and from Grand Junction to meet with the BLM Director will result in more commercial airline seats filled, hotel rooms occupied and meals consumed at local restaurants. The increased visibility of having “Grand Junction” in the dateline of press releases by the agency could garner the attention of other entities, public and private, looking to locate facilities and employees in a community with affordable housing and an outdoor oriented lifestyle that can offer mountain biking experiences on your lunch hour. The bottom line is that no one can fully anticipate how this announcement will strengthen our economy in the years to come...but we definitely know it will.

So, what did we all learn from this successful effort? It is important to have a common goal, can do attitude and...oh yah...it also takes a village. Our congratulations to all involved and by all means, keep up the good work! I’m confident this is just one of many efforts that will lead to an improved economy and a better community in the future.

staff time and overhead to make the Alliance a reality. Today Diane Schwenke and Robin Brown act as Executive Directors. Meetings are held at the Chamber and Chamber staff develop the agendas and keep the corporation's minutes. Voting directors are composed of five members appointed by GJEP and five members appointed by the Chamber with one member appointed by the ten directors.

The effort took a huge step forward with the passage of the 3% increase in the lodging tax in the fall of 2018. Chamber staff, in collaboration with the Greater Grand Junction Sports Commission and the Visit Grand Junction Advisory Board worked tirelessly to inform voters on how this really was a tax that they did not pay and one they would see real benefits from. The Air Service Alliance receives 1% of this new tax and recently pledged their first year's income to match a \$900,000 grant application to the Federal Aviation Administration to provide a minimum revenue guarantee to an airline that would deliver daily direct flights to the West Coast, preferably San Francisco. Such guarantees are necessary in order to ensure that an airline flying that route will not lose money as competition for new service is fierce among commercial airports of our size.

It is anticipated that we may know as early as October if the application is successful in which case negotiations would begin immediately with a carrier in hopes of having direct flights to the West Coast on a daily basis by mid to late 2020.

For almost four years the Chamber has been a strong partner in this effort to improve the business climate with board members and staff devoting countless hours to all of the steps that were necessary to get us to this point. GJEP, Grand Junction Regional Airport, City of Grand Junction, Visit GJ, Greater Grand Junction Sports Authority and Mesa County have all played significant roles. Diane Schwenke, Chamber CEO notes,

Grid Security Top of Mind for August Energy Briefing

Earlier this summer there was a blackout in parts of New York City that lasted for hours with similar occurrences in the Pacific Northwest. With all of the discussion about how to generate electricity there has been very little discussion about the grid that delivers that electricity to our homes and businesses. Is the grid capable of handling our growing needs? And how secure is the system?

In June of this year the U.S. Senate passed the Securing Energy Infrastructure Act with bipartisan support. A companion bill has been introduced in the US House of Representatives. The legislation will defend the U.S. energy grid by partnering with industry to utilize engineering concepts to remove vulnerabilities that could allow hackers to access the grid through holes in digital software systems.

The Colorado General Assembly may be out of session but that doesn't mean that there are not substantive policy discussions going on this summer regarding potential employer mandates such as Family Medical Leave.

The Grand Junction Chamber is proud to partner with the Colorado Chamber for our next Sunrise Seminar, sponsored by Home Loan Insurance on Friday, **September 13th, 9:00 AM to 10:30 AM** in the FCI Boardroom located on the lower level of the Chamber building.


